The scholarships and Financial Aids offered by Broward International University are designed based in three main pillars:

- **Eligibility.** We establish basic criteria about your personal experience and sociodemographic characteristics to being able to apply and obtain the below mentioned scholarships.
- The **compromise** with the Community of South Florida, facilitating the access to our programs to all those people that have financial limitations, or people that can proof their academic merits and social merits in their communities.
- The main focus on **Professional Development** putting the compromise and precision towards the professional and personal development of our students as a key element of our scholarships.

To sum up, BIU has designed 3 categories for the scholarships offered:

- General School Scholarships
 - Academic Merit
 - Social Compromise and Merits
 - Economical Needs
 - Florida Residents
- Scholarships by program.

At the same time, we have linked our scholarships to some relevant people that somehow did a great social impact and/or economic development through their actions. In this sense, we are not only expecting our students to apply for the scholarships for economic reasons, but also to make a tribute to those character and feel inspired by them and their story, making themselves to be positioned as a future game changer in their field of study.

Scholarships and financial aids will be deducted from the total program cost in which the student enrolled, once the scholarship is approved and confirmed, by applying the proportional amount to the period of economic compromise made by the student.

From the Admission Department and on behalf of all the school representatives we encourage you to find out the stories of all these inspiring characters and to apply to the scholarship that fits you the most in order to make the difference and become into your best version.

GENERAL RULES:

- Scholarships and financial aids are non-cumulative in any of the cases
- The student will be able to apply to different scholarships at the same time, only under the following circumstances:
 - By Choosing a “general school scholarship”, which have a fixed deadline for delivering the documentation and where the receivers will be announced 15 days prior to the beginning of the academic course of enrollment.
 - At the same time, the student will be able to apply to a “scholarship per program”, in which there’s a weekly allocation and where the only imperative condition is having the enrollment confirmation approved.
 - In case of duplicity of scholarships, the one with highest value will be applied and payments and/or devolutions will be adjusted accordingly by the University
 - In any of the cases, a “scholarship by program” can be cumulative to a “General School Scholarship”.
- To keep on providing the Academic merit related scholarship, it will be of utmost importance to keep an average grade for the academic period equal to or higher than the grade for obtaining the scholarship
